## WHAT'S REALITY CHECK?

REALITY CHECK is a series of youth-driven, youthfocused after-school events, sponsored by the Sun Prairie Youth and Families Commission.

- ➤ It was designed to uncover important topics, create positive accountability, and connect youth through conversation.
- ➤ Students in grades 8-12 from Cardinal Heights Upper Middle School (CHUMS), Peace Lutheran, PPA, Sacred Hearts and Sun Prairie High School were invited.
- ➤ In response to the overwhelming response to the first event in 2014, the Commission launched a *Mini Series* a series of smaller work groups to tackle major issues that were brought forward.

#### REALITY CHECK—

#### THE MINI SERIES

- Applications were distributed through school staff.
- The October 2016 work group focused on transportation needs for youth and adults in Sun Prairie.
- Adults from throughout the community attended to observe, and praise students for showing an interest in the direction of our community.
- Attendees enjoyed pizza, soda, and great conversation!

#### WHAT HAPPENED?

Students addressed three questions on the issue of transportation in Sun Prairie:

- ➤What is working?
- ➤ What's not working?
- ➤ What can we do, as students and as a community?

Students wrote/drew on tables as they explored each question. They transferred important points to sticky notes for sharing with the whole group in a circle discussion. Creativity was encouraged!

### WHAT IS WORKING...

#### Work group members:

- ✓ Enjoy riding in smaller buses.
- ✓ Think our City has good stop sign placement, but agree it's still hard to get out of Walmart.
- ✓ Appreciate the City's good taxi service.
- ✓ Like roundabouts because they are safe and efficient, but feel that drivers need some help understanding what path they should be on.
- ✓ Thank our crossing guards for making us safer, and encourage more adults to do the same.
- ✓ Applaud our good roads and bike routes.

### AREAS FOR IMPROVEMENT...

According to teens from the Mini Series work group, Sun Prairie needs:

- More energy efficiency/fewer carbon emissions
- City planning that benefits drivers and pedestrians
- Hiking trails not just for recreation, but to get places
- Mass transportation to get anywhere you want to go (like Starbucks or a Performing Arts Center), including:
  - Accessible taxis and buses
  - A bus or buses just for teens that transports youth to a Recreation Center. Teens could be picked up in specific:
    - Neighborhoods
    - School
    - Library

# OPPORTUNITIES FOR ACTION: STUDENTS

- ✓ Write letters to the City Council
- ✓ Meet with and lobby local elected officials
- ✓ Hold fundraisers
- Encourage community to create more places for teens to hang out
- ✓ Ask teachers to relate school lessons to important community issues like transportation
- ✓ Reach out through Student Council and other students
- ✓ Circulate petitions
- ✓ Work to increase community connections
- ✓ Sponsor issue debates among youth
